## Nitish Kumar reviews Pitru Paksha Mela preparations in Gaya

**Patna,** Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar reached Gaya on Wednesday to review preparations for the upcoming Pitru Paksha Mela, one of the most significant religious gatherings for Hindus in the region.

The Chief Minister began his visit by offering prayers at the Vishnupad temple, where he performed rituals inside the sanctum sanctorum.

He then inspected arrangements at key sites, including the Falgu River, Rubber Dam, Devghat, and Sitakund, seeking detailed updates from officials about the ongoing works to ensure smooth conduct of the fair.

Later, Nitish Kumar chaired a review meeting at the Gaya Collectorate, where development projects and mela-related arrangements were discussed in detail.

Senior officials, including the District Magistrate and SSP of Gaya, were present.

The Chief Minister is also scheduled to visit Chakand block, where he will interact with Jeevika Didis and lay the foundation stones for several schemes. Following this, he



will travel to Belaganj, the constituency of JD(U) MLA Manorama Devi, to address a grand public meeting at Padav Maidan, where a large gathering is expected.

Tight security arrangements have been put in place in view of the Chief Minister's tour.

The Pitru Paksha Mela is starting from September 8 and will continue for around 2 weeks, allowing pilgrims to participate in the spiritual ceremonies and prayers, which hold great significance in Hindu traditions.

The event is a major religious gathering, with Gaya being one of the holiest places

for performing this ancestral ritual.

Every year, devotees from across the globe who believe in Hindu culture flock to Gaya to perform the 'pind daan' rituals for their ancestors during the Pitru Paksha Mela.

Along with Gaya, large gatherings are also seen in the Purnip block of Patna, where similar ancestral rites are performed with equal devotion.

The Bihar government makes special arrangements for the event every year to provide good facilities, including accommodation, transport and others to devotees who attend the fair.

## K'taka govt holds high-level meet to develop Lord Hanuman's birthplace Anjanadri Hills



**Bengaluru,** The Karnataka government on Wednesday convened a high-level meeting to discuss development of the Anjanadri pilgrimage centre in Koppal district, believed to be the birthplace of Lord Hanuman.

Chief Minister Siddaramaiah chaired a meeting at his residence on Wednesday regarding the development of Anjanadri Kshetra. The Chief Minister's Office (CMO) informed in its official statement that the CM has issued a directive that Anjanadri Hill must be developed, given its tourism, mythological, and spiritual significance.

"Works worth Rs 200 crore have been approved for the development in Phase 1 and Phase 2. Of this, Rs 10 crore has been released so far, and additional funds will be allocated by the Finance Department to release the remaining grants," CM Siddaramaiah stated.

"Facilities will be created to help even elderly devotees reach the hilltop, and discussions were held on constructing a circumambulatory (pradakshina) path. During Hanuman Jayanti, lakhs of

devotees visit the hill, and a large number of tourists from North India also visit the shrine. To accommodate pilgrims, dormitory facilities, steps to help senior devotees climb the hill, construction of a community hall, and other tourist amenities along with basic infrastructure in and around the kshetra need to be developed," CM Siddaramaiah announced.

Since most of the approved works fall within forest land, the Forest Department must issue NOC, and CM Siddaramaiah instructed that necessary steps be taken to obtain it.

As per the 2024-25 State Budget, the Karnataka government has approved ropeway projects at 11 tourist destinations across the state, including Anjanadri Hill, under the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model. The meeting was attended by Minister for Law and Tourism H.K. Patil, Additional Chief Secretary Anjan Parvez, and senior officials from the Tourism Department.

## AI, cybersecurity and sustainable development will give new direction to UP: CM Yogi



**Kanpur,** Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Wednesday threw light on the importance of industry-academia collaboration in shaping India's technological future.

He was speaking at IIT Kanpur's engagement programme 'Samavay'.

Addressing faculty, students, and industry leaders, the Chief Minister praised IIT Kanpur's contributions over the past six decades, citing its role in emerging technologies, including drone innovation. Reflecting on Uttar Pradesh's transformation, Yogi said the state's contribution to the national GDP, which stood at 14 per cent in 1947, had dropped to 7-8 per cent by 2017 due to neglect, lack of investment, and migration of youth.

"UP was once called a sick state. But in the last eight years, the picture has changed completely. Today, UP is the country's second-largest economy, driven by better security, investment, infrastructure, and governance. Visible progress has been made in every sector," he asserted.

The Chief Minister highlighted UP's pioneering role in the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), noting that the state assembly was the first in the country to dedicate a 36-hour special session to discuss ways of achieving SDGs. Citing Bundelkhand as an example, he said the once drought-prone region now has tap water in every household, irrigated fields, and investment flowing into defense corridor nodes at Chitrakoot and Jhansi.

He reminded the audience of India's rich economic history, pointing out that the country contributed nearly 25 per cent to the world's GDP until the 17th century, before a steep decline during colonial rule brought it down to just 2 per cent by 1947.

"In the last 11 years, we have seen India rise again.

Today, it is the fourth-largest economy in the world and will soon become the third. In the

future, we will also get an opportunity to become the second largest," he said, stressing that the growth journey is about building a developed and self-reliant India. The Chief Minister praised IIT Kanpur's contributions over the past six decades, citing its role in emerging technologies, including drone innovation. Reflecting on Uttar Pradesh's transformation, Yogi said the state's contribution to the national GDP, which stood at 14 per cent in 1947, had dropped to 7-8 per cent by 2017 due to neglect, lack of investment, and migration of youth.
